Contact Information: Please make sure the office has your most current contact information.

Vandalism: If you encounter vandalism we ask that you photograph the

damage and report it to the office immediately. Any vandalized barrels should be replaced instead of refilled, so we can make sure the barrel are clean. If you see anything of a threatening nature such as weapons or suspicious device at the station please call 911 immediately.

Emergency Response System: Spot tracks movement and can send distress signals. Spotty and Rover function fine.

<u>Border Patrol</u> At the request of the Border Patrol Sector Chief, if you see BP agents near water stations we ask that you take a picture of their license plate and take down the date and time. Forward the pictures to Joel as soon as possible, with an explanation about them.

<u>SPOT:</u> The tracking device is required for all water runs. Please ensure that it is turned on and in tracking mode. This helps us find you if you run into problems. Please do not call anyone from Humane Borders during a water run unless it is an emergency.

Equipment and Trucks: Please make sure to report any broken equipment to the office. Do not store any equipment in the door well.
